University College London's Mullard Space Science Laboratory (MSSL) is seeking a postdoctoral Research Associate to work on calibration and data preparation activities. MSSL is the UK's largest university based space science research institution and is involved in many leading space research missions (<http://www.mssl.ucl.ac.uk/>).

The post is concerned with the task of archiving high quality calibrated data from the PEACE electron spectrometer instruments on the four ESA Cluster magnetospheric research spacecraft, as part of the European Space Agency Cluster Active Archive (CAA) project.

The successful candidate will join a team responsible for all aspects of PEACE operations. The candidate will contribute to in-flight calibration of the 8 Cluster PEACE sensors and to the preparation and validation of PEACE data for the CAA (electron moments, 2D and 3D velocity distributions data). Other activities in support of the CAA may include developing and supporting display software, and provision of documentation. The calibration role will include the application of established methods, but is also concerned with the development of improved techniques to cope with sensor aging, and with adapting and improving the tools with a view to future challenges presented by in-flight calibration of instruments on the proposed 12 spacecraft Cross-Scale mission (an ESA Cosmic Visions mission candidate).

Applicants will have a PhD in physics (ideally space plasma physics), mathematics, statistics or a related field. A familiarity with any of the following would be an advantage: Linux, Perl, C/C++, IDL, as would experience in the analysis of large datasets.
