The Clinical and Molecular Genetics Unit is led by Professor Gudrun Moore. It is comprised of 9 separate research groups represented by an excellent critical mass of approximately 40 staff members. Specific research areas across the Unit are disorder-diverse but reflect a common theme of gene discovery for rare inherited childhood developmental disorders whether they are metabolic, developmental, endocrine or syndromic.

The purpose of this vacancy is to study the functional role of the imprinted gene *PHLDA2* as a biomarker for fetal growth in chorion villus samples. The role is funded by a SPARKS University Award, held by Professor Moore and Dr Chitty at ICH. You will work closely with their research teams to set up and run experiments and record, analyse and provide written reports of the experiments completed.
