The 3-Year BA programme in French Studies is available with a range of minors. Depending on your options, up to 80% of your courses will be delivered in French:

- BA French Studies
- BA French Studies with Business
- BA French Studies with History
- BA French Studies with International Relations





BA French Studies

- 'Language' courses (ULL) and 'Content' courses (ULC)
- Opportunity to choose from a broad range of 'Content' courses (literature, visual culture, history, business, linguistics, cinema, politics)
- Taught predominantly in French between 65-80% of classes taught in French, depending on Options in BA2 and BA3 (lower for students taking Minors in Business, IR or History)





Year 1 – Ways of Reading

- Intensive grammar and core writing skills (3h per week)
- Oral proficiency development 'compétences professionnelles' with CV development and job interview practice (1h per week)
- Introduction to French Culture (literature, art, cinema) 2h per week
- Modern History of France and the Colonial Empire 2h per week
- Contemporary French Politics and Society (one semester) 2h per week
- Cultural Studies (one semester) 2h per week

- Broad choice of semester-long 'content' modules, 6h per week
- In French: Gender and Sexuality, History, Linguistics, Twentieth-Century Art
- In English: Politics and Fiction, France, Britain and Empire, Climate Politics, Queer Politics, Global Cinema, Marketing, Management, Social Movements and the politics of protest, Visual imagery and mass culture

- Optional Research Dissertation




