Allocation Policy

Intercollegiate Halls are open to students studying a full-time course at a publicly funded university in London.

Applications before 4th September 2023

Our rooms are offered through the quota system. Each college within the University of London receives a quota of our rooms.

Individual colleges will manage their own application process and make their own decision on where their students are placed. Your college will decide the building and room type that is allocated to you.

Once your college has made the decision, they will pass this information onto us, and we will then send out room offers to the successful applicants. Your room number will be allocated randomly by our booking system.

Please contact your college accommodation team directly for more information on their allocation policy and on how to apply for a room.

Applications after 4th September 2023

Any rooms not allocated by 31st August 2023, will be offered to full time students who have applied on our waiting list dependent on availability.

Applying to our waiting list does not guarantee you an offer for accommodation. Places will be allocated on preference and availability.

Once you have been offered a room, you will be given 48 hours to accept the offer and pay the deposit. If the offer is not accepted within the deadline, the room will be offered the next student on the waiting list.

Unfortunately, we are not able to provide a timeline for responses as this depends on what rooms become available. Our waiting list will remain open throughout the academic year, please note that we cannot guarantee a response before the start of the academic year.
