UoL-SIM Lecture 2022

A Changing Accountancy Profession: Future Impacts, Directions, Shapes

Paradoxically, the one constant in life is change. And so has it always been, with communities, societies, nations, the world, impacted by a mix of expected and unexpected developments and events. This applies to organisations, be they commercial businesses, governments and agencies, non-profits, and professional bodies and associations. The consequences of impacts include drivers for changes in ways in which organisations conduct their work practices, demanding accommodation of natural evolution and designing engineered evolution.

The world of accountancy is no different. It is impacted by anticipated and unexpected changes, with consequences for the conduct of work practices. In that context, there are current realities for the nature, role and application of accountancy practices. Such realities include, illustratively, accelerated innovations in digital developments, including AI applications, and challenges concerning the audit landscape, compounded by the recent pandemic and its impact on national, regional and global economies. There are emerging consequences for the nature of work, and the skills development of staff, both in the accountancy profession and other organisations. In Singapore, for example, the Jobs Transformation Maps initiative has been launched with a view to assisting accounting professionals to redefine their job roles and acquire new skills sets to meet the challenges of a world impacted by a litany of realities.

The UoL-SIM Lecture 2022 captures the drivers for and consequences of changes in the world of accountancy and maps potential future landscapes. In so doing Professor Alan Parkinson from UCL School of Management is joined by two industry/consultancy-based panellists to identify and discuss implications for the layout of those future landscapes, involving observations and questions from audience participants.

Professor Alan Parkinson (Keynote Speaker)

Alan is based in University College London (UCL) where he is Professor of Financial Education and School Deputy Director (Education), and Lead of the Finance, Accounting and Economics Teaching Team in UCL School of Management. He is a qualified accountant, two masters degrees, with a Doctorate in Education. He has designed and delivered modules across the spectrum within the Accounting and Finance arena, both face-to-face and online. He is a Fellow of the Centre for Distance Education at University of London. He has played significant roles in the development and delivery of University of London online global programmes: MSc Professional Accountancy, and MSc Accounting and Financial Management Launch. He is very much involved in UCL's online MBA, and with UCL's MBA venture with Peking University in Beijing. He is a Faculty Adviser at Harvard Medical School.

In 2018 he was awarded UK Public Sector Accountancy Lecturer of the Year by PQ magazine. Alan's scholarship research interests focus on Curriculum Evaluation, Performance Measurement in Accounting Education, Historical Perspectives on Business, and Technology Applications within Education. He presents regularly at national and international Education-related conferences and workshops, winning several awards, and publishes in scholarship journals, and in custom textbooks. Alan likes all sport (especially football – soccer to some – and travels the emotional roller coaster journey accompanying the life and times of a Tottenham Hotspur FC supporter), reading, and travel.
