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About the University of London

Your study experience

Located in Paris's seventh arrondissement, our historic building overlooks the Esplanade des Invalides and the Eiffel Tower, within easy reach of key political and educational focal points.

Our small classes allow for individual attention and a close-knit interdisciplinary community across ages and academic subjects.

Study resources and facilities

You will benefit from access to a wide range of study resources and facilities, in a scholarly setting.

The Institute in Paris Library is the primary source of support and research material for undergraduate and master's students, offering subject-specific resources and access to dozens of electronic databases via the University of London's Senate House Library and our partnership with Queen Mary University of London.

Beyond the resources offered on-site, the library staff can direct you to any off-site provisions.

We are committed to providing appropriate support to students with a disability or specific learning requirements.

Libraries off-campus

Paris offers an extensive choice of public and institutional libraries – many in close proximity to the Institute – which you can access as a student.

Some libraries in Paris offer holdings in English, and you can also find specialist collections to complement your studies.

Through the Institute in Paris Library, students have access to the American Library in Paris, which is within walking distance. Postgraduate students may also access the Sciences Po Library if they wish.

Other Parisian libraries of interest include:

- Bibliothèque Interuniversitaire Sainte Geneviève
- Bibliothèque Nationale de France (BNF)
- Bibliothèque Publique d'Information in the Pompidou Centre.

As an undergraduate or master's student of the University of London Institute in Paris, you can also make use of Senate House Library and Queen Mary libraries when in London.

BA International Politics

Our unique three-year degree, delivered entirely in English in the heart of Paris, will enable you to learn about 'doing' international politics while gaining international experience.

The course's immersive approach, blending traditional seminars with fieldwork, provides a firm theoretical and practical foundation for understanding international politics, and you will graduate with a respected University of London degree. You can also choose the programme with French as a minor, in which case a French qualification is required.

BA International Politics

UCAS code: L241

This unique three-year degree focuses on the practical and theoretical aspects of international politics. You will develop an advanced understanding of state, non-state, governmental and non-governmental actors 'doing' international politics in the contemporary world. You will learn how these actors perform international politics and how theories and methods can be used to understand their actions. This course is taught in English. This unique three-year degree focuses on the practical and theoretical aspects of international politics while developing and consolidating your French language skills. MA Urban History and Culture

This degree provides a unique opportunity to study the social, political, cultural and economic development of two of the great urban environments of the Western world: Paris and London.

Immerse yourself in two cosmopolitan cities and benefit from exposure to the culture and traditions of two major European capitals, gaining invaluable inter-cultural understanding and experience.

In the heart of the city

Through site visits and analysis, you will explore how the growth of

city living and management has shaped the fabric of the world. The degree, taught in English, enables you to develop your methodological approaches to what distinguishes and what connects Paris and London, while expanding these comparative insights towards a broader engagement with urban history and culture, and the challenges that cities face today.

Leading to a respected University of London degree, the course consists of four modules plus a dissertation and an assessed research methodology component. Two core modules will be delivered in the autumn term in Paris, taught by University of London Institute in Paris and Queen Mary University of

London faculty, and two optional modules taken from a range offered in Paris at the Institute in Paris and in London at Queen Mary University of London in the second term. You can choose, therefore, between a split-site degree or a full year in Paris.

Graduates of this degree go on to careers and further study in a wide range of contexts. Many progress into urban planning, policy and advocacy, and roles at NGOs, charities and non-profits. Others have been successful in the museum sector, both in curation and research, as well as journalism and communications.

Entry requirements

An upper second-class honours degree in a relevant humanities-related subject is required. Or a recognised equivalent from an accredited overseas institution.

Careers advice, seminars and events

As a student of the Institute in Paris, you can access advice from both the Careers Group and Queen Mary's Careers and Enterprise service.

Whether you need help with writing a CV, developing your interview skills or planning further study once you graduate, you will benefit from support and services to help you make the most of the opportunities offered by your degree.

How we support you:

- One-to-one appointments with a careers consultant, covering anything from career choice and job hunting through to CV and interview advice
- A comprehensive range of information and tools on the Careers and Enterprise webpages including: resources for global job hunting; industry guide; psychometric tests; advice on CVs and interviews
- Access to the Careers Hub where you can register for online events including alumni panels, workshops and employer events, and search for opportunities such as micro-internships, work experience, graduate schemes and graduate jobs.



We organise seminars and workshops focusing on the wider French and European job markets to complement the advice and guidance offered by Queen Mary's Careers and Enterprise. Careers Talks with Institute in Paris alumni and other local professionals are organised both by the Institute and the Students' Union.

Once you graduate, you automatically become part of the global community of University of London alumni. This gives you access to all the benefits and services offered by the University to its alumni, including three years

of free careers advice offered through Queen Mary's Careers and Enterprise, alumni membership of Senate House Library, and invitations to events in Paris, London and around the world.

Please note: the careers services mentioned here are available to BA and MA students. PhD students have access to the SAS Careers Service, which offers similar support, such as CV and cover letter advice, application guidance, mock interviews, and one-on-one appointments throughout your studies and for up to two years after graduation.

Graduate employment

With the globalisation of markets, expertise in multiple languages is becoming increasingly important and candidates with intercultural skills are becoming more and more sought after by employers.

In addition, the invaluable international experience you gain during the course of your degree will make you stand out from the crowd, as your experience will demonstrate to future employers your ability to adapt and be independent, opening up a huge range of career opportunities. The skills developed in our programmes are highly valued, especially for anyone planning to embark on an international career.

Student life in Paris

Paris truly has something for everyone – it’s consistently ranked as one of the world’s best student cities.

Discover Parisian arts and culture

Living in Paris, you’ll be able to enjoy not only its world-famous landmarks and museums, such as the Sacré-Coeur and the Musée du Louvre, but also its hidden gems. Paris has over 150 museums and galleries, many of which are free for those under 26 (and free for everyone on the first Sunday of the month).

Film festivals take place throughout the year, including the three-day Printemps du Cinéma and summer’s outdoor Cinéma en plein air. The city is also home to a thriving performing arts scene, from live music and dance to comedy and theatre.

Relaxing green spaces and waterways

The Institute overlooks the Esplanade des Invalides, where students often relax and picnic during summer. Other green spaces include the Jardin du Luxembourg, the Tuileries, and the beautiful Parc des Buttes-Chaumont.

Enjoy walks along the Canal Saint-Martin and the Seine with its many

bridges, including the spectacular Pont Alexandre III, just a few minutes’ walk from the Institute.

Get active

Paris has fantastic sport and exercise facilities, which are discounted for those under 26. Every district has at least two local swimming pools, as well as tennis courts and other activities. You can often find last-minute tickets to major sporting events at an affordable price.

Live like a local

As a student here, you’ll have the chance to experience Paris off the beaten path. Street markets selling fresh produce, flowers and bric-a-brac are great places to soak up the local atmosphere – the multi-ethnic Marché d’Aligre is known as one of the most diverse food markets in the city.

Enjoy discounted travel

Life can be expensive in a major city, but plenty of discounts are available. The Imagine-R travel pass gives students under 26 unlimited travel in the Île-de-France region for half the cost of a regular Navigo monthly pass – and SNCF also offers youth railcards, so you can explore France on a budget!

Accommodation, health and welfare

We want to make your experience of living and studying in Paris as rewarding and positive as possible.

A wide choice of student accommodation

We provide detailed information about housing options for students in Paris. A guide to finding accommodation is updated annually and available from contact@ulip.lon.ac.uk. You can also join our student Facebook group for support and advice.

Students can reserve a studio at a Nexity Studéa or Estudines student hall of residence, where flats are block-booked by the Institute, making this an easy option to arrange in advance of your arrival. The residences are located 30 minutes from campus. Studios are fully furnished with private bathrooms and most service charges are included.

For students who prefer to rent privately, the Institute can act as guarantor to help you secure accommodation.

Students can apply for housing benefit (CAF) from the French government, which can range between €120 and €220 per month, depending on whether students meet the conditions (age, type of accommodation, duration of stay).



Healthcare and pastoral care

As a student at the Institute in Paris you can have access to French national health cover, the Sécurité sociale. You will need to register for this on a dedicated website, and we will provide all the required information. Students from the European Economic Area must ensure they have a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).

Student, Academic and External Services operate an open-door

policy to offer advice and guidance to any student facing a practical difficulty during their time in France, so if you have any issues there is always someone to talk to.

You will also be assigned a personal adviser, a supportive and approachable member of the teaching staff who is there to help you with any problems or concerns you may have – whether you are homesick or are struggling with an assignment.

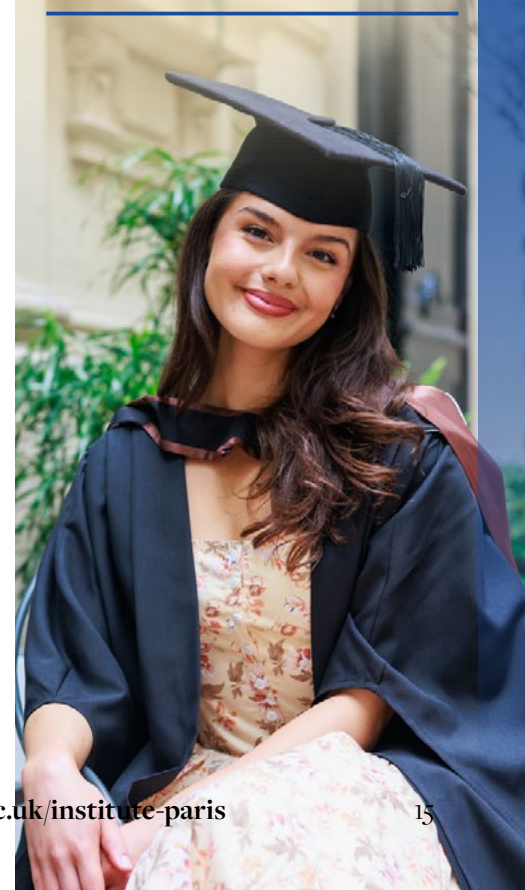

How to apply and entry requirements



Our aim is to make the application process as simple as possible for you.

Undergraduate

All undergraduate applications, including those from international students and mature students, should be made through the Universities and Colleges Admissions System (UCAS) website at ucas.ac.uk

Entry requirements:

- general entrance requirements (please view degree webpage) and
- English language requirements (we may require a test of proficiency in English).

Selection process:

- If you are shortlisted, you may be invited to a phone interview.
- All shortlisted candidates and those holding offers are invited to attend our Journée de Rencontres. This event offers an opportunity to visit the Institute and meet staff and current students. Parents or other guests are most welcome to accompany prospective students.

Postgraduate

Details of the application procedure and entry requirements for the MA Urban History and Culture are available on the Institute in Paris website: bit.ly/UoL-Paris-History-Culture

Applicants to our PhD programme are usually required to hold a master's degree. However, we will consider applications from candidates who do not meet the formal academic requirements but who offer alternative qualifications and/or relevant experience. English is the standard language of instruction and you will be required to demonstrate an appropriate level of proficiency. It is possible on certain conditions to complete a doctorate at the Institute in French. For more information, visit: bit.ly/UoL-Paris-PhD
